AGREEMENT #1078

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between TILLAMOOK COUNTY, acting by and through its Board of Commissioners, hereinafter called COUNTY, and TILLAMOOK CITY, acting by and through its Common Council, hereinafter called CITY.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, certain jurisdictional questions have arisen relating to parking of motor vehicles in the vicinity of the County Courthouse, and WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners held the 29th day of August 1979, at which time representatives of the CITY were present, it was determined that it would be in the best interests of the general public that these jurisdictional matters be resolved and set forth by written agreement, NOW, THEREFORE,

IN CONSIDERATION of the foregoing recitals it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1) In consideration of the benefits to be derived by virtue of this agreement CITY hereby leases to COUNTY pursuant to ORS 223.840 for the duration of this agreement the following designated parking spaces or such other parking spaces in the immediate vicinity of the County Courthouse as may hereafter be mutually agreed upon: *leased*

Post Office

A) Four (4) parking spaces located at the east end of the City owned parking lot which is situated on the north side of First Street at Laurel Avenue.

2) CITY will designate and post for the duration of this agreement four (4) parking spaces immediately adjacent to the Courthouse on the east side of Laurel Street for the purpose of providing free thirty (30) minute parking for the public while conducting business in the County Courthouse.

- 3) COUNTY will install the necessary curbing and sidewalk on the westerly portion of Madrona immediately adjacent to the County Courthouse in accordance with the Courthouse parking plans as approved by the Tillamook City Planning Commission on August 16, 1979.
- 4) CITY will designate, for the duration of this agreement, un-metered parallel parking spaces along the length of the westerly portion of Madrona Avenue immediately adjacent to the County Courthouse. CITY will further designate and post three of these parking spaces in the vicinity of the County Courthouse as may hereafter be mutually agreed upon for the purpose of county personnel parking.
- 5) COUNTY will pave all unpaved portions of Madrona Avenue immediately adjacent to the County Courthouse at such time as CITY completes the installation of curbing on the easterly portion of said street.
- 6) COUNTY will undertake proceedings to transfer all jurisdiction to CITY of that portion of County-owned property known as Block 2, Thayer's Addition which is used as the northerly extension of Laurel Avenue.
- 7) CITY will have complete jurisdiction over all streets and over all parking areas except those areas set forth in any ordinance adopted by Tillamook County pursuant to ORS 274.420-430.
- 8) This agreement will be in force and effect on and after the effective date of the jurisdictional transfer set forth in Section (7) of this agreement.

9) This agreement may be terminated upon thirty (30) day written notice by either party. If so terminated the jurisdictional transfer set forth in Section (7) of this agreement shall be null and void and of no further force and effect.

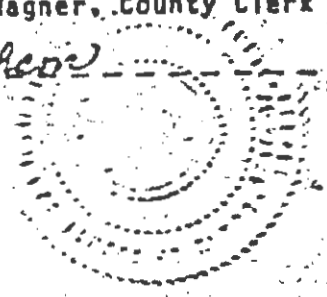

ORDER

This matter coming on to be heard this 26th day of October, 1979, at a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners at which time it appears that the Common Council for Tillamook City has heretofore formally requested the Board of Commissioners to undertake proceedings to surrender Tillamook County's jurisdiction of all that portion of Block 2, Thayer's Addition to Tillamook which lies within the northerly extension of Laurel Street between 1st and 2nd Streets in Tillamook City, and

It further appearing that the Board of Commissioners did cause notice of a public hearing to consider said jurisdictional transfer to be published in the Headlight Herald a newspaper of general circulation within the county, for four consecutive weeks as by law required, and

It further appearing that at said hearing held this day no persons appeared to offer remonstrance or other testimony as to why Tillamook County's jurisdiction over said parcel should not be so transferred, and

TILLAMOOK

It further appearing that it would be in the best interests of the general public that Tillamook County's jurisdiction over said parcel be surrendered to the City of Tillamook for so long as shall be mutually agreed upon as set forth in that certain agreement dated September 7, 1979, by and between Tillamook County and the City of Tillamook attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein, and the Board of Commissioners being fully advised; NOW THEREFORE,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Tillamook County's jurisdiction over all that portion of Block 2, Thayers Addition to Tillamook which lies within the northerly extension of Laurel Street between 1st and 2nd Streets, be and is hereby surrendered to the City of Tillamook for so long as that certain agreement hereinbefore set forth shall remain in effect.
