

PORT OF CORPUS CHRISTI AUTHORITY OF NUECES COUNTY

DUTIES:

It is their responsibility to guide the port in accordance with the provision of the Texas State Constitution. Efforts are directed toward encouraging industrial expansion, attracting new cargo, building and maintaining public terminals, setting operational policy and cooperating with the Federal Government as local sponsor in maintaining and further improving vital navigation channels.

COMPOSITION:

Seven-member Board of Commissioners, representing South Texas' multi-faceted business community. Three commissioners are appointed by the Corpus Christi City Council, the governing body of the City of Corpus Christi, three commissioners are appointed by the Commissioners Court of Nueces County and one appointed by the Commissioners Court of San Patricio County.

CREATION & AUTHORITY:

In 1922 by Sec. 62.021 et seq as authorized by Article XVI, Sec. 59 of the Texas Constitution and amended by H.B No. 1301 of the 63rd Regular Session.

MEETS:

Second Tuesday of every month, at 9:00 a.m. in the Port's office, 222 Power St. Corpus Christi, Texas.

TERMS: Three year staggered terms. Two Nueces County board positions expire in December 2002 and every 3 years thereafter, and one Nueces County board position expires in December 2004 and every 3 years thereafter.
