A brief summary of my nuclear industry and U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (USNRC) work:

- 1977 Bachelor's degree in Engineering Physics, University of Louisville, Kentucky
- 1977-1982 Active duty, U.S. Navy
- 1982-1985 Nuclear Engineer with Northeast Utilities. I was awarded an USNRC **reactor operator's license and an USNRC Senior Reactor Operator Certification** for Millstone Unit 1 (BWR3). I ran the operator requalification program for Millstone Unit 1, creating all lesson plans, weekly examinations, and the annual requalification exam.
- 1985-1997 Employed by the USNRC in Region I as a resident inspector. I was a resident inspector at Nine Mile Point, Unit 1, and senior resident inspector at the following plants: Ginna, Pilgrim, Maine Yankee, and Salem/Hope Creek. I received numerous awards for my inspection findings during my twelve years as a resident inspector.
- 1997-1998 Employed by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (USNRC) in Region IV as a Senior Project engineer assisting the Branch Chief with responsibility for inspection program oversight of Cooper Nuclear Station, Arkansas Nuclear One, and River Bend.
- 1998-2002 Employed by the USNRC in Region IV as Chief, Reactor Project Branch C, with responsibility for inspection program oversight (initially) of Cooper Nuclear Station, ANO, and River Bend. After a DRP reorganization in 2001, I had responsibility for Cooper Nuclear Station and Fort Calhoun, the Region IV plants for the pilot of the new performance based inspection program. I had Region IV lead responsibility at the Branch Chief level for implementing the pilot inspection program in Region IV.
- 2002-2004 Employed by the USNRC in Region IV as Chief, Engineering Branch, with responsibility for inspection oversight of engineering, fire protection, maintenance rule, and ISI inspections. I also frequently provided the management oversight for Special Inspections conducted in Region IV.
- 2004 From May until retirement in September, employed by the USNRC in Region IV first as Acting Deputy Director, Division of Reactor Safety, and then as Acting Deputy Director, Division of Reactor Projects.
- 2005-2009 Post retirement: sought out by Arizona Public Service to assist Palo Verde Nuclear Station in identifying the strengths and areas for improvement in preparing for a 95002 inspection scheduled for the fall of 2005. From October through mid-December 2005, I also assisted the International Atomic Energy Administration in preparing for and conducting the International Conference on Operational Safety Performance in Nuclear Installations. Working with Mr. Ellis Merschoff, I conducted an assessment of San Onofre Nuclear Generating Stations readiness for the USNRC's Component Design Basis Inspection in April 2006, that was recognized as instrumental in completing a successful USNRC inspection. In July 2006, Mr. Merschoff and I completed a rigorous assessment of preparations and controls of proposed heavy lifts at Fort Calhoun station. In October, November and December of 2006, I assisted Palo Verde Nuclear Generating Station with preparations for USNRC regulatory conferences, providing USNRC perspective and results of fact-finding that significantly improved meeting readiness. From March 5, 2007 through March 27, 2008 I assisted Palo Verde in the development and implementation of the Improved Performance And Cultural Transformation program. This program was developed to correct declining performance trends and affected every employee at Palo Verde Nuclear Generating Station.
