The year 2020 has brought many challenges to our patients with diabetes and the food banks Diabetes Hands On program. Due to social distancing guidelines and the compromised health of our participants we were not able to do as many classes. We completed 2 eight week series which was a total of 32 classes. We held 20 diabetes pantry classes. We saw a total of 192 follow up participants, before the social distance guidelines went into place. We have stayed in touch through phone calls and mail the past 6 months. We sent out 2400 Diabetes Newsletters.

We have also provided passive education through diabetes education handouts and recipe books in a drive by pantry for those with diabetes and are also having trouble purchasing healthy foods

Your gift of \$800 has helped to buy a portion of the A1c's we need to monitor the participants outcomes from the class. We also used the funding to purchase some educational materials and books for healthy cooking on a budget.

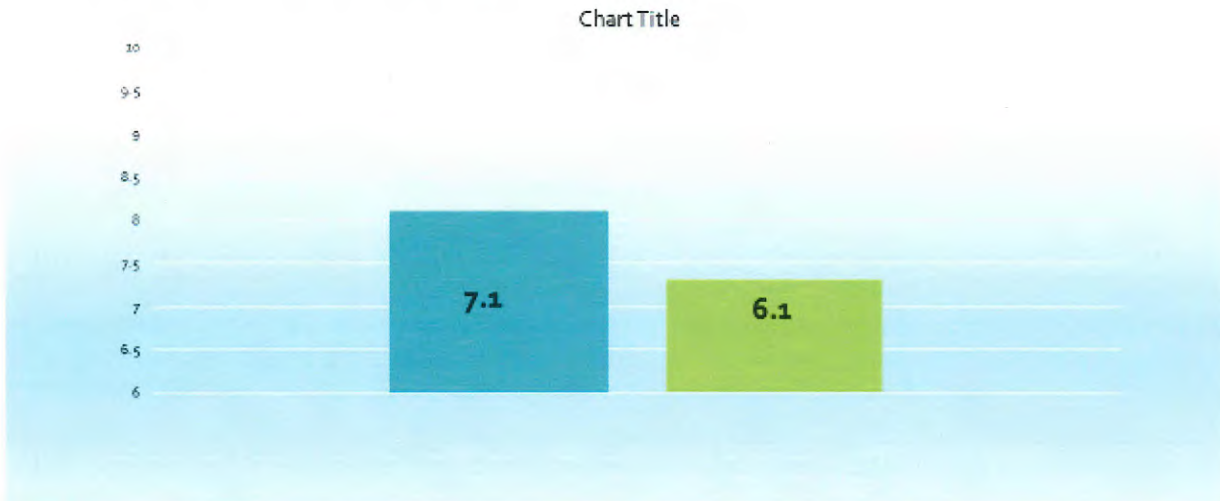

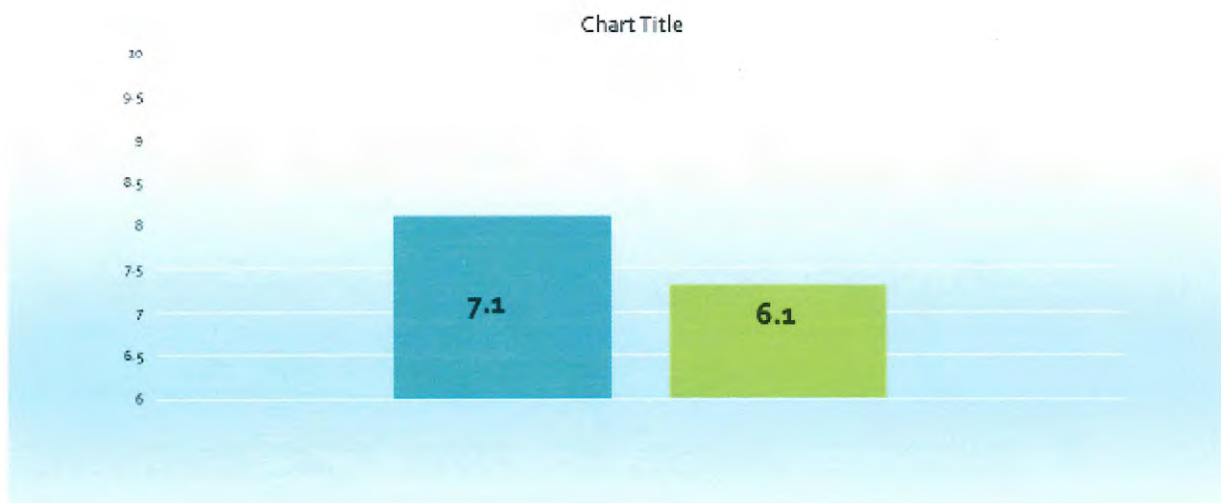
